- Volunteer rosters will be posted in the main tent (just in front of the playground and at each gate.
- Snacks and a token of our appreciation for volunteering, will be available in the main tent.
- Lunch will be available around noon each day for volunteers working a minimum of 2 events.

Trial Information:

We would like to thank you in advance for your help and cooperation with keeping things moving. With the exception of the first event each day, the schedule is an approximation only. Please allow sufficient time to set up, check in and ready your dog for your first event.

Saturday & Sunday: 8:00 a.m. for 1st dog on the line.

- We use a 2 ring alternating format, starting in Ring 1 (closest to the scoring tent).
- Courses will be open for walkthroughs <u>as soon they have been cleared by the judge</u>. Once the previous event is completed, please clear the ring to allow those who have not had the opportunity to walk the course.
- A timed walkthrough will be available for volunteers and handlers working or running in the previous event who didn't have an opportunity to walk the course.
- Handlers 'first up' on the gate list for each event should take precedent walking in order to have sufficient time to ready their dog prior to the start of the event.
- Please check in with the gate steward.
- Please be in the 'waiting/on deck' area, and ensure the gate steward knows you are there, at least 3 dogs prior to your run.



 Toys are allowed in the ring for FEO runs provided they are in accordance with AAC standards and used in a safe manner: Toys must be in a good state of repair (no fur or stuffing coming loose). Handlers are permitted to interact with their dog during a run by tugging with the toy or rolling/tossing the toy a safe distance away from equipment. Food, toys containing food, audible toys, and audible training aids (e.g. clickers, whistles), are NOT permitted in the ring.

Ribbons, Titles and Awards:

- Starters Ribbons, Super Q's and Titles/Awards (all levels) will be presented as time permits.
 Advanced and Masters Qualifying Ribbons will be available self-serve. Please join us at centre field when we celebrate your fellow competitor's accomplishments.
- A "Title/Award" achievement pad is available by the ribbons in the main tent. Please make sure
 to share your accomplishment(s) with us when you and your pup earn a title/award so that we
 may do likewise.
- Move-ups are available throughout the weekend. A move-up sheet is available on the Ribbon table in the main tent and must be used for all such changes.

Reminders/Courtesies:

Campers: Please pay Lilian Cook (Security site #13)

Please keep your dogs on leash everywhere (except in the ring) and pick up after your dogs. Lake Ontario Park (LOP) is, of course, a public park and spectators are welcome. Therefore, we ask you to please keep in mind that we are all ambassadors of the sport and treat the general public with consideration. If you feel that spectators actions, i.e. too close to the ring, etc. are potentially detrimental to your time in the ring or your fellow handlers, please let us know.

Driving on the grass is not permissible (with the exception of camp sites).

Recycling:

Recycling is provided by The City of Kingston. Therefore, we encourage you to recycle whenever possible and that you refrain from putting your garbage and/or dog waste in the recycling bins (that's just nasty!).

Please re-fill your water bottle at the Culligan water stations. The water is for handlers and dogs alike. Every little bit towards reducing our foot/paw prints is greatly appreciated.

Amenities:

- Portable toilets are located a short distance from the fields.
- A Puppy Pool is available to cool down your furry pal.
- There is plenty of day crating available near the field. A loading zone is between sites 12 & 13, accessed by the roadway on the west side of the agility fields. Parking is available in & around the camping areas.

Note: There is no food vendor on site.
